## PRELIMINARY ENGLISH TEST (PET)

University of Cambridge ESOL (part of UCLES) provides examinations in English for speakers of other languages.

PET is a general proficiency examination at Level B1 in the Council of Europe Common European Framework. It is at Entry Level 3 in the UK National Qualifications Framework.

PET is recognised and used by many higher education institutions and corporations across the world.

The examination has three papers: Reading and Writing, Listening, Speaking. Performance in PET is indicated as follows:

Pass with Merit

Successful performance in PET indicates that candidates can communicate in English in a range of everyday situations.

Candidates who have not achieved a PET passing grade (Council of Europe Level B1), but have demonstrated ability at the level below this, are awarded a certificate stating Council of Europe Level A2.

The Association of Language Testers in Europe (ALTE) has developed a framework which covers six levels of language proficiency aligned to the Council of Europe Common European Framework. Long-term research carried out by ALTE has shown what language learners can typically do at each level.

The table below gives some examples of general ability at Level B1, plus ability in each of the skill areas and in a range of contexts (social & tourist, work and study). It also gives examples of general ability at Level A2.

Overall general ability	CAN understand simple questions and instructions.	CAN understand straightforward information within a known area.
	CAN express simple opinions or requirements in a familiar context.	CAN complete forms and write short simple letters or postcards related to personal information.
